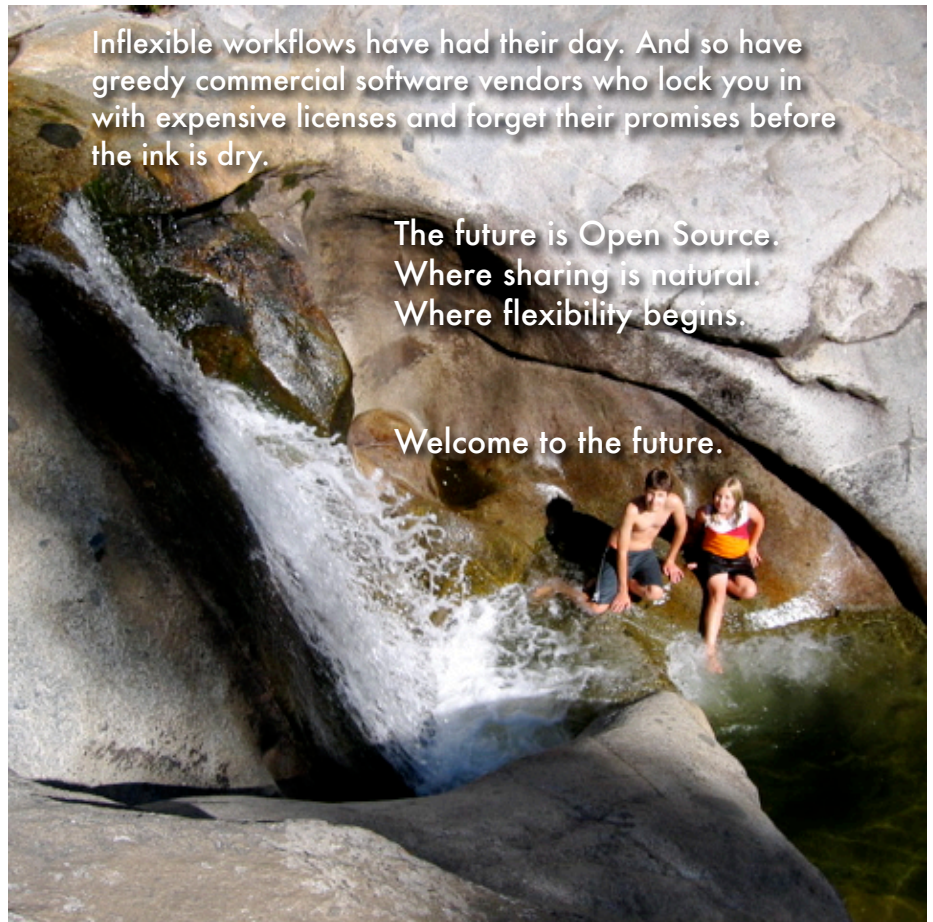

The workshop will develop a clear picture of the needs of the participants and outline requirements for potential solutions. The outlook for collaboration, and cost sharing will be discussed.

Insights on Collaboration: Working together allows the participants to obtain more supportive, more powerful, systems than could be achieved alone. The Workshop will transcend technical/political barriers and explore the options for collaboration.
